Chris Laufman's Music Bio:

"Fuck What You Heard This is What I Know" - Manager

Formed in 2004 by Chris Nichols and Anna Fraszier, "Fuck What You Heard ... " quickly developed an exclusive audience thanks in large part to Chris Laufman. In 2005 they sold their 115 songs on e-bay for 100\$. They ended up netting 50 buyers and a good amount of money. They played 3 live shows, each one equally awful. Their music can only be described as abstract soundscapes that are unenjoyable to listen to. Many who have heard them claim they did for the burgeoning lo-fi movement at the time what Ariel Pink did for polished, over produced Rock n' Roll. Chris Nichols died in 2006. Laufman has been commissioned to do a documentary on the bands influence on the few who have heard them. The release date is set for November 15th, 2012. It is titled "115".

"Guinea" - Drummer

Guinea was Chris Laufman's biggest mistake. In his own words the band was "a bunch of stupid assholes", "they should have been an L.A. band". In 2007 Chris Laufman was responsible for landing them a residency at the Carnegie Museum of Art. The premise was that they would perform each day in the same spot in the museum for 50 days. In these 50 days they would play interpretations of Jimi Hendrixs' whole recorded catalog. "it was an incredible project, probably something i won't be able to convince a museum to support again, and i did it with a bunch of stupid assholes". Jim Holm, lead singer of Guinea, describes the concept as "fucking"

lame". Chris Laufman, who played drums in the band, was left to complete the project by himself. What resulted was a 3 hour tape of Laufman playing drums to every Jimi Hendrix song ever cataloged.

"Wise Blood" - Lead Vocals

The most internationally acclaimed of all of Chris Laufman's projects. In his own words "people love Wise Blood". Recently Wise Blood went on Tour with Friendly Fires and hung out with celebrities. Wise Blood's first EP "+" came out in mid 2010. Another EP, "These Wings", was released in September of 2011. For Wise Blood's full length debut Laufman says to expect "a concept album based on the 3 things that have influenced me the most profoundly in the past year". The release is slated for February of 2012, after which Laufman says to "expect the inevitable implosion of "Wise Blood""


"We think it's heaven-sent" say the label
