

THE COCOA SUPPLY CHAIN

The supply chain starts here



cocoa pods are harvested from cocoa trees




the cocoa pods are collected in large baskets which workers carry on the head to curing area




then the farmers remove the cocoa beans from their pods and they are fermented and dried

the dried cured cocoa beans are then packed into sacks for transport

the cocoa beans are transported into trucks by road to the Ghanaian Port where they are packed into containers




Cocoa butter + cocoa powder are produced at the processing factory



Trucks transport the cocoa beans from the port of Singapore to a processing factory




A container ship transports the cocoa beans by sea to the Port of Singapore




The cocoa products are transported in trucks by road back to the port of Singapore




a container ship transports cocoa products by sea to the Port of Melbourne

a refrigerated truck transports the chocolate bars from the factory to the Port in Tasmania




the ingredients are processed at the factory to make bars
